



SENIOR DOMESTIC WELCOME TO SEASON INFORMATION

WELCOME

Welcome to the North Gold Coast Seahawks Senior Domestic competition. We hope you and your team enjoy your time playing in the competition and you are with us for many seasons to come.

The following information is for your reference throughout the season and covers most aspects of the competition that you need to be aware of as a Team Delegate.

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

Council have advised us that both vaccinated and non-vaccinated patrons are allowed into their venues. Other guidelines are in line with whatever the current guidelines are at the time. i.e. wearing of masks indoors, use of the Check-In app etc.

MATCH FEES - TEAMPAY

A Match Fee is to be paid ahead of each game you are to play, and this must be paid via the Teampay app. Each player in your team must have the app and have it linked to a valid credit/debit card. Then on game day, the Team Delegate selects the players playing in the game and it will draw each players' share of the Match Fee (plus a small processing fee) from their account.

This should be completed at least 15 minutes prior to your game starting time. Games will not commence until payment is confirmed on our end by the Court Controller. The game clock will start at the scheduled time and your team will be penalised 2-points per minute or part thereof for a late start.

How you manage your team is up to you, but we recommend making all players that commit to your team required to pay their share each week whether they play or not. This prevents committed players potentially paying high fees each week to cover the Match Fee if other players do not turn up. By managing payments this way you can even complete your Match Fee payment during the day on Game Day to ensure that you are ready to go at tip-off time.

Note. Your Teampay Team Code differs from your Gameday (formerly SportsTG) Team Code.

PLAYER TO TEAM REGISTRATIONS

All players must register to your team via the Gameday Player to Team Form. All players must complete this ahead of playing the first time, irrespective if their annual BQ registration is due for renewal. Without registering this way, they will not appear on the Courtside app that is used for scoring the games.

The form will automatically detect whether the player is due to renew their BQ registration. To recognise this though players must login with their existing Gameday login, even if they have played at another association or are returning from a break in playing.

FILL-IN PLAYER REGISTRATIONS

Should you require a fill-in player at any point during the season they must also be registered with Basketball Queensland to be allowed the play, however they can access a Short-Term 14-day BQ registration for a nominal fee. The process for this is similar to the above process for your players to register for your team however it is accessed from a different form.

If you are filling-in for a Senior Domestic Team, and need to be allocated to that team, please click below. You will need your team's SportsTG Team Code. Your Teal Delegate should have this, otherwise find it listed on the first page of the Form. Note. All players must be registered. Players playing under a false name will be suspended, along with the Team Delegate also being suspended, both for 2 weeks.

SCORING

Each team is required to provide a scorer for each game. One scorer will operate the scoreboard and the other the iPad. It is essential that the two scorers communicate throughout the game to ensure that the two devices match.

In the senior competition you may “sub off the Scorebench”, meaning if you don't have someone to score, you can use one of your substitutes, and when they go on the court, the player they are replacing takes their place on the Scorebench.

Note, if you have no scorer and only 5 players, then one must score, and you are left with 4 players on the court.

PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

Players can only play in one team on any given competition day. The only exception to this is if two types of competition are played on the one day. E.g., A player could play in a Mixed team and a Men's Masters team on a Sunday. However, they couldn't play in a Men's C Grade and Men's B Grade team on a Tuesday.

Only when a team has 4 or less players can they get a fill-in from the same grade or a lower grade to have 5 players for the game.

FINALS ELIGIBILITY

Players must play a minimum of 40% of regular season games to qualify for finals. If your grade has byes, they are removed from the equation. E.g., 12 rounds, 2 byes, must play 40% of 10 games.

Players can get credited for games missed through injury/illness by presenting a Medical Certificate. The Certificate should state why games were missed, along with the start and end dates that they were unfit for play.

If 1 player gets injured during the season, remind them to get a Certificate when getting treatment to avoid having to go back and get one at the end of the season.

FINALS STRUCTURE

4 team – 3-week format:

Week 1 – Semi Finals

SF1 – 1st vs 2nd

SF2 – 3rd vs 4th

Week 2 – Preliminary Final

PF – Loser of SF1 vs Winner SF2

Week 3 – Grand Final

GF – Winner of SF1 vs Winner PF

UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS

The entire team is required to be in the same uniform, singlet and shorts. Shorts cannot have pockets. Singlets must be uniquely numbered (1-99). T-Shirts are not permitted under singlets. Compression items are allowed, however no sleeves. Vest style upper and full leg is permitted.

Players out of uniform will incur a 5-point penalty.

We highly recommend sourcing reversible singlets to avoid colour clashes.

FORFEITS

There are two types of forfeits:

Forfeit – Walkover Where a team is unable to field at least 4 players
Forfeit – Ineligible Player Where a team plays a player unable to play in that competition. E.g., An A Grade player in B Grade

All forfeits results in 0 Premiership Points for the offending team. Forfeits due to Walkover also incur a fine.

The rates for fines are:

Unnotified Walkover	– 2 x Match Fee
Notified (Less than 48 hours notice)	– 1.5 x Match Fee
Notified (More than 48 hours notice)	– 1 x Match Fee

GLORY LEAGUE

Every game is automatically filmed by Glory League cameras that are installed at Coomera and Runaway Bay Indoor Sports Centres. Players will be able to view their full games, record full statistics and view and share highlights. Each player will also receive a highlight reel of their made baskets after each game.

This footage is also used for Tribunal Hearings. We see everything, so be on your best behaviour!

TRIBUNAL & DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

Players may be Reported and required to attend a Tribunal Hearing. If reported, a player along with their Team Delegate will receive notification of the report, a copy of it, and a date and time to attend a hearing. The player may take one witness should they wish to support their case.

At the Hearing you will be asked for a plea for each charge made against you. Both the Reporting Official and the Player, along with their witnesses will have an opportunity to explain their version of events and the Tribunal panel will ask questions about what occurred.

If applicable, Glory League footage will also be reviewed as part of the Hearing.

At the end of the Hearing the panel will present their findings and inform the player of the penalties against them if there are any. Penalties apply Australia-wide, so if you play at other centres also, your penalty will affect you there too.

When called for a hearing attendance is mandatory. If you do not attend, the hearing will go ahead without you and a determination made. Non-attendance can result in up to 20 weeks suspension on top of any other penalties imposed.
